





Criteria for selecting grant holders

<u>A.</u>	Formal (access) criteria
<u>B.</u>	Substantive criteria

Applications will be assessed for compliance within the following selection criteria:

- A. Formal (access) criteria score: 0-1 point
- B. Substantive criteria score: 0-10 points

During the substantive assessment, the project can receive a maximum of 60 points. For a project to be recommended for participation in the acceleration programme, it must:

- Meet all formal criteria, i.e., obtain 10 points;
- Obtain the required minimum score in each criterion of substantive assessment;
- Obtain a total of at least 26 points.
